Assume...don't!

It became apparent to us, your BCCP committee volunteers, when putting pen to paper on this, the third issue of the Beavercreek Bulletin, that we are "assuming" the citizens of Beavercreek knows all about the BCCP. In order to correct this mistake, this months feature article will provide a history, description, beliefs and current activities of the BCCP as follows:

The Beavercreek Committee for Community Planning

In 1997 Metro identified and included areas 25 and 26 (the Beavercreek area) as Urban Growth Boundary Reserves.

On September 10, 1997 a Beavercreek community meeting was held. Two volunteer member committees were formed - the Beavercreek Committee for Community Planning (BCCP) and Keep Beavercreek Rural (KBR). The objectives for each were:

BCCP - to educate itself and then educate the citizens of Beavercreek regarding its options for representation and planning and decision-making authority.

KBR - to utilize the intervention process in an attempt to try to remove areas 25 and 26 as Urban Growth Boundary Reserves

From September to March the BCCP educated itself regarding the options Beavercreek has in order to secure representation at all levels of government and to have planing and decision making authority regarding its future. The BCCP also incorporated as a committee, filed for 501C3 non-profit corporation status and obtained insurance.

In March of 1998, three community meetings were held by the BCCP to share what it had learned. 402 citizens attended. A survey was distributed. 189 surveys were returned. 139 of those surveys asked the BCCP to bring the Incorporation of Beavercreek as a city to election.

Today the BCCP is fundraising, completing an Economic Feasibility Study, monitoring the activities of, and are actively involved with, Oregon City, Clackamas County, Metro and the State of Oregon, and communicating with the citizens of


Beavercreek. It is the goal of the BCCP to bring the Incorporation of Beavercreek as a city to general election in November, 2000.
